

Summer School – Psycholinguistics day-to-day program

This elementary to intermediate level course will provide the student with a basic knowledge of psycholinguistics, a research domain on the intersection of linguistics, psychology, and neuroscience. It focuses on the psycholinguistic approach to mapping out the learning and cognitive mechanisms that allow humans to pick up patterns and regularities in linguistic input. The following research topics in psycholinguistics will be presented: language acquisition, language production and comprehension, experimental methods, and atypical language comprehension and production.
